Godly friends	Yea rather, <i>blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it</i> (Luke 11:28).
Blood brothers	My mother and my brethren are these <i>which hear the word of God, and do it</i> (Luke 8:21).
Blood blothers	He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that
	loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him (John 14:21).

Self-Denial	<i>Christ pleased not himself</i> ; the reproaches of them reproaching thee fell on me (Rom 15:3). Let this mind be in you <i>who made himself of no reputation</i> (Phil 2:5). He was in all points <i>tempted like as we are, yet without sin</i> (Heb 4:15).
Public thanks	Where they did eat bread, <i>after that the Lord had given thanks</i> (John 6:23). He took the five loaves, and the two fishes, and <i>looking up to heaven, he blessed</i> , and brake, and gave the loaves to his disciples, and the disciples to the multitude (Matt 14:19).
Heavenly Minded	<i>I have set the LORD always before me</i> : I shall not be moved (Ps 16:12). Who <i>for the joy that was set before him</i> endured the cross, despising the shame (Heb 12:2).
