# What Hath God Wrought!

"Surely there is no enchantment against Jacob, neither is there any divination against Israel: according to this time it shall be said of Jacob and of Israel, **What hath God wrought**!"

Numbers 23:23

#### Introduction:

- 1. Today we celebrate our church's 38<sup>th</sup> anniversary God has done great things with us, in us, for us.
- 2. We do not celebrate our history by pictures of buildings, pastors, and weddings or by statistical history.
- 3. A church is a group of believers tied together by God's grace, the Spirit's work, and Christ's headship.
- 4. A church is compared to stones in a temple and to body parts of a body under Christ and in the Spirit.
- 5. Three years ago we celebrated our 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary by a detailed history of doctrinal changes by grace.
- 6. But a church is not a body of doctrine it is a group of people with one Head and one Spirit directing.
- 7. We have 111 members (all 18 and over) by the marvelous grace and providence of God adding to us.
- 8. God has done great things calling each of us out of the world to love His Son and uniting us as one.
- 9. Love of Christ and love of others is the measure, not doctrine (Rev 2:1-5; I Cor 13:1-3; Jn 13:34-35).
- 10. Doctrine is tapestries that decorate the temple and books in the library for faith, worship, and growth.
- 11. Christianity and a local church are team sports with no place for individual isolation or withdrawal.
- 12. It is Catholic monasticism to think you can attend, listen to a homily, take communion, and go home.
- 13. We began with Psalm 126:1-3 which describes this day of celebration, testimonies, and a mirth feast.
- 14. A brother this morning by God's kind providence alone chose Psalm 40 to prepare us for the sermon.
- 15. We will use the next service to testify of God's individual grace (Gal 1:24; Mark 5:19-20; Ps 34:1-3).

### **Opening Text**

- A. Balaam's prophecies, intended by Balak and Balaam to be curses, are inspired blessings.

- D. Balaam's second set of blessings (out of four) contains our chosen text (Nu 23:18-24).
  - 1. When God promises or speaks, no alteration of circumstances affects Him (23:19).
  - 2. We studied this by His oath to make Messiah a priest like Melchisedec (Ps 110:4).
  - 3. God's prophets and apostles declared irreversible blessings for His church (23:20).
  - 4. God views us differently than other men in and under Christ's righteousness (23:21).
  - 5. And there is indeed a shout among us of a great king Jesus Christ the Lord (23:21).
  - 6. God saved Israel out of Egypt, but His strength saved us from worse things (23:22).
  - 7. There is no power in hell or the prince of darkness to hinder our final victory (23:23).
  - 8. When the gospel word went to the Gentiles, it turned the world upside down (23:23).
  - 9. He saved each of us and united us together; we must say, What hath God wrought!

## **Goal of Sermon**

- A. A church is a group or congregation of individuals tied together by the Spirit of God.
  - 1. Consider our local church as *God's temple* formed by stones He prepared and set.
  - 2. We also consider our church as *Christ's body* formed by parts He ordained and set.
- B. Rather than doctrine and history as at other times, we want to see His individual work.
  - 1. What has He done in our individual lives to save us, form us, and put us together.
  - 2. We will share personal testimonies of His gracious work (Gal 1:24; Mark 5:19-20).

- C. What hath God wrought! is not a question, but exclamatory praise for His workmanship!
  - 1. Wrought. Work into shape; create, construct, fashion, form, make, mould, or shape.
  - 2. We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works (Ephesians 2:10).
  - 3. We are together in this church by His will and for His work (I Cor 12:18; Acts 2:47).

### Our Church Is a Temple

- A. It is God's house; *temple* is the right word for His presence and worship (I Tim 3:15).
- B. Starting with Jacob pouring oil on *stones* (Bethel), we have the best *temple* our church.
  - 1. The apostles said so (I Cor 3:16-17; II Cor 6:16; Eph 2:21; II Thes 2:4; Rev 11:1-2).
  - 2. Solomon and others used masons and stones (I Kgs 5:15-18; II Kgs 12:11-12; 22:6).
  - 3. Peter and Paul described its stones and work carefully (I Peter 2:4-6; Eph 2:19-22).
  - 4. It is all about Him as the precious chief cornerstone for our confidence (I Pet 2:4-6).
  - 5. The apostles provide the rest of the foundation by their inspired epistles (Eph 2:20).
- C. The apostles admired the stones of Herod's temple, but ours is much better (Luke 21:5).
- D. A collection of men fit together well is a powerful thing think of David's mighty men.

### **Our Temple Is Made of Individual Stones**

- A. God inhabits our temple/church; Jesus is the chief cornerstone; apostles the foundation.
- B. We are the edifice lively stones by quickening for edifying (I Peter 2:5; Ep 4:15-16).
  - 1. God carefully chose, crafted, shaped, placed each in a wall (I Cor 12:18; Acts 2:47).
  - 2. He elects, justifies, regenerates, and converts to have loving children for His temple.
  - 3. The long chain of related events (often called dots) is marvelous for us to consider.
  - 4. A temple made of lively stones is an organism not a dead, manmade organization.
  - 5. Every body part is necessary for our church as much as body parts are for an athlete.
  - 6. Body parts vary in function and appearance, but they are all needed (I Co 12:14-22).
  - 7. Weaker members, not foolish ones, get extra attention and honor (I Cor 12:23-26).
- C. The Bible has fabulous examples of God choosing individual stones for His temple: Moses, Samson, Samuel, David the youngest son of Jesse, the Ethiopian eunuch, Saul of Tarsus, Lydia, a jailor, Phebe, Timothy, Stephanas, Caesar's household, Gaius, etc.
- D. Each soul that God brings to our church by whatever means should light up your heart.
  - 1. Thus, every contact we meet by whatever means, including our website, is important.
  - 2. Thus, our evangelistic mantra is one soul at a time, because of the Bible emphasis.

# **God's Stonework is Marvelous**

- A. He chose and prepared a precious Cornerstone (Is 28:16; Ps 118:22-23; Matt 21:42-45).
- B. The Jews killed this Stone, but God raised Him from the dead (Ac 4:11-12; I Pe 2:6-8).
- C. He prepares pastors with new hearts and teaches them to fight (I Sa 10:6; Ps 144:1-2).
- D. He ordained ministerial offices and the men (Ep 4:8-15; Gal 1:15-16; I Tim 4:14; 6:12).
- E. His ministers are severely warned about the stones they add to the Stone (I Co 3:11-17).
- F. A Gadarene was chosen and changed greatly by God's power for marvel (Mk 5:19-20).

- G. He saved and converted Cornelius and others check later (Acts 10; 21:8,16; history).
- H. He opened the heart of Lydia, who then immediately served the apostles (Ac 16:14-15).
- I. The dots (events) of each member's life are perfectly coordinated by God's providence.
- J. He replaces *stony* hearts by hearts of flesh (Eze 11:19; 36:26; Ac 2:37; 7:54; II Co 3:3).
- K. We pray, work, and exclude for daughters as polished, palace *cornerstones* (Ps 144:12).

#### We Also Have Stone Work

- A. Each stone is to do its best and help each other stone do its best (He 10:24-25; 3:12-13).
- B. We are to edify each other or build up (Rom 14:19; 15:2; I Cor 10:23; I Thess 5:11).
- C. Jesus Christ has called ministers and members to edify the church (Eph 4:12,16,29).
- D. You cannot join this church without being taught these things and committing to them.
- E. God has shown and stressed to us *one another* duties throughout the New Testament.
- F. Love is the greatest many ways, but it is the bond of unity (Eph 4:1-3,16; Col 3:12-15).
- G. There at about twelve ministries of the Spirit in Ephesians for us to pursue and obtain.
- H. Mere membership accomplishes little, we want to greatly grow in grace (II Peter 3:18).

### Replacing Stones is God and our Joint Work

- A. He arranges heresies to expose strange children that don't belong (I Cor 11:19; Ps 144).
- B. We obey by rejecting them (I Cor 5:11-13), and He causes repentance or replacement.
- C. The improvement in beauty and quality is phenomenal by doing things His way quickly.
- D. Our examples of exchanging belly worshippers for spiritual zealots is fabulous. Glory!
- E. The Bible has fabulous examples of God removing one and providing another better: David for Saul; Zadok for Abiathar; Benaiah for Joab; Matthias or Paul for Judas; Silas for Barnabas; Timothy for Demas; etc.

## **In Our Temple Its ALL ABOUT HIM**

- A. God does not care about silver or gold or a fancy building even in the O.T. (Hag 2:6-9).
- B. What gives His temple the ultimate glory is the preeminence of His Son (Col 1:14-20).
- C. The bond that holds all stones together is Jesus our Lord dying for us (I Cor 10:16-17).
- D. Our worship is in the spirit of the inner man and mind, not an outward temple (Jn 4:24).
- E. We are blood brothers and sisters without regard to other factors (Gal 3:28; Col 3:11).

# We Have Obeyed; He Has Fulfilled

- A. He told us to reject darkness and error; we have; He kept His promises (II Cor 6:14-18).
- B. If we love and obey Him as a church, as in John 14:15-24, there is no limit of fellowship.
- C. If we love Him and are hot for Him, He will come and fellowship with us (Rev 3:20).
- D. We have not yet seen what God can do perfecting our church by perfecting its stones.

#### **Conclusion:**

- 1. The patriarchs' house of God (Bethel) was a mysterious blessing in this pagan, sinful, wicked world.
- 2. But we have God's presence and power with us to far greater degrees by His great blessings in Christ.
- 3. What we have in spiritual blessings and natural, national, marital blessings and others is mind blowing.
- 4. We must say, What hath God wrought! for it is all of Him, by Him, through Him, and to Him. Glory!
- 5. What is our future? If we will love and obey Him more, unknown blessing, What hath God wrought!
