## SAVED IN CHILDBEARING

"Notwithstanding she shall be saved in childbearing, if they continue in faith and charity and holiness with sobriety." I Timothy 2:15

- I. The Promise of Salvation In Childbearing Must Be Understood In Its Context (I Timothy 2:9-14).
  - A. Women must be adorned with shamefacedness, sobriety, and works (2:9-10 cp I Peter 3:1-6).
    - 1. **Shamefacedness**. 1. Modesty, bashfulness, shyness. 2. The state of being ashamed.
    - 2. **Sobriety**. 2. Moderation in any respect. 3. Staidness, gravity, seriousness.
    - 3. Good works beautify a godly woman, not her broided hair, gold, pearls, or costly array.
  - B. Women are to learn in silence and subjection under the authority of the man (2:11-12).
    - 1. If a woman will learn anything, she is to ask her husband at home (I Cor 14:34-35).
    - 2. Women are strictly prohibited from being teachers. They are to be silent in church.
    - 3. They may not exert any authority over men in public assemblies due to their weakness.
  - C. Women were created after the man, and they were guilty of being deceived in Eden (2:13-14).
    - 1. Adam was made before Eve, who was created to be a help meet for Adam (I Cor 11:3,8-9).
    - 2. Because Eve was deceived by Satan, she showed great weakness in the transgression.
    - 3. The nature of Eve's transgression should lead women to shamefacedness and sobriety.
    - 4. By her failure, childbearing is cursed, and she is under greater rule of her husband (Ge 3:16).
  - D. Women shall be saved from their condemnation, if they show proper evidence in works (2:15).
    - 1. **Notwithstanding**. A. *prep*. In spite of. B. *adv*. Nevertheless, still, yet. C. *conj*. Although.
    - 2. Since Paul had strongly criticized and/or restricted all women, he now promised salvation.
    - 3. Note carefully the alternate use of singular and plural nouns and pronouns in this passage.
      - a. It uses "women," "the woman," "a woman," "Eve," "the woman," "she," and "they."
      - b. "The man" and "the woman" are collective nouns: singular in form plural in meaning.
      - c. Other uses of collective nouns are Romans 1:26-27; I Cor 7:3-4,13-14; 11:3-15; Ps 14:1.
    - 4. Her salvation will come by way of childbearing. "In" describes relation to the act of birth.
- II. There are basically two or three false interpretations assumed by commentators and most Christians.
  - A. All godly women with good works will be saved from the foretold pain and travail of childbirth.
    - 1. The salvation here is not "from" childbearing, but "in" childbearing. Birth brings salvation.
    - 2. Scripture does not teach anywhere else that Eve's curse is lifted for godliness (II Cor 13:1).
    - 3. It is easy to see in all ages that elect women did not give birth easier than reprobate women.
  - B. Godly women will be saved from the great grief of childbirth, if they have obedient children.
    - 1. The context has a far greater subject under consideration than the natural pains of delivery.
    - 2. There is no antecedent for the pronoun "they" to justify applying it to women's children.
    - 3. The obedience of children is not necessary to joy. Birth itself can bring joy (John 16:21).
  - C. Godly women will be saved eternally in spite of their difficulties in childbirth and its curse.
    - 1. How are they saved "in" childbearing? What about women that never gave birth, or girls?
    - 2. How are they saved "in" childbearing? If eternal life is the salvation, how is it "in" birth?
    - 3. There is a more direct and obvious solution based on scripture itself and this context.
  - D. Commentators understanding this text as explained below are Adam Clarke and John Gill.
- III. The Prophecy of Salvation in Childbearing Is A Glorious Doctrine of the Scriptures.
  - A. When God judged Eve with sorrow in birth, He foretold victory by her birthed Seed (Ge 3:13-16).
  - B. God prophesied to Abraham that His Seed would come from Sarah's womb (Genesis 17:15-22).
  - C. Leah named her fourth son, Judah, in prophesy of the praise that he would bring (Gen 29:35).
  - D. God gave conception to Ruth by Boaz to cause the birth of David's grandfather (Ruth 4:13-17).
  - E. Bathsheba bore a son to David named Solomon, whom the Lord called His son (II Samuel 12:24).
  - F. Isaiah prophesied to Israel that God would cause a special childbirth to occur (Isaiah 7:14; 9:6).

- G. Jeremiah foretold God would create a new thing a woman would compass a man (Jer 31:22).
- H. Joseph was told to name Mary's virgin-born Son, Jesus; because He would save (Mat 1:18-25).
- IV. The Birth of Jesus Christ Was the Event That Fulfilled the Prophecies and the Promise.
  - A. Mary brought forth Jesus Christ without the aid of man. It was truly her seed (Luke 1:34-35).
  - B. The angels announced the arrival of the Saviour, Christ the Lord, as a babe (Luke 2:8-17).
  - C. Mary presented Jesus at the temple, since He was a male Who opened the womb (Luke 2:23).
  - D. Simeon, with the Holy Ghost upon him, prophesied about this special child (Luke 2:25-35).
  - E. The wise men sought a young child and found Him with His mother (Matthew 2:2,8-11).
  - F. Jesus the Redeemer was made of a woman made of Mary in childbirth (Galatians 4:4-5).
  - G. The apostles and disciples referred to their Saviour as the "holy child Jesus" (Acts 4:27,30).
- V. Women May Know They Are Saved In Mary's Childbearing By Continuing In Good Works.
  - A. The very act that God cursed is seen as the means of salvation by Mary's childbirth (I Tim 2:15).
  - B. Though still under the curse, as is evident in childbirth, women may have hope of salvation.
  - C. The "if" conditional statement describes conditions for evidence. Otherwise there is no hope.
  - D. Similar language is used with the same intent elsewhere (Col 1:23; John 8:31; Heb 3:6,14; etc.).
  - E. Faith (II Pet 1:5,10), charity (I John 3:14), holiness (Heb 12:14), and sobriety (I Thess 5:5-11) are evidences of salvation, not conditions. These works show one who is already saved by grace.
  - F. Do you wish you had delivered the Christ child? You can be rather blessed (Luke 11:27-28).
