THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

Have you ever made a bold self-justifying statement, like the brothers did in vs 7-9, and been proven to be very wrong, like them? We may speak too quickly with over-confidence for a number of reasons. We may be denying responsibility for some mistake or failure. We may resent being connected with some situation we despise. We may not know all the facts. We may be sincere while someone else was not. We may not know what someone else has done. We may be truthful and someone else was untruthful. We may be stretching the truth in an attempt to appear better than we are. Let's strive to know a situation thoroughly before we speak.

HELP:
