EXODUS 15; March 6; Moses' Song to the LORD

ANALYSIS: 1. How did the Israelites celebrate their deliverance from the pursing Egyptians?

2. Pick out a few of your favorite statements of praise, honor and accomplishment directed to the LORD in this song. [for example: "the horse and his rider hath He thrown into the sea].

3. What effect did Israel believe the miraculous crossing of the Red sea would have on the nations they would pass by or displace?

4. After Moses led the people away from the Red sea, for three days they lacked ______ and could not drink the waters at ______ until Moses cast in a______.

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

Moses could sing! Moses ascribes to the LORD the glory displayed in the stunning victory over the oppressing Egyptian power. The words "unto the LORD" are the keynote of his song (v 1). Hear Moses personally worship the LORD with: "I will sing," "The LORD is my strength and song," "my salvation," "my God," "I will prepare Him," "I will exalt Him" (vs 1-2). Then he declares the unrivaled excellencies of his God: "a man of war," glorious in power," "thy excellency," "thy wrath," "didst blow with thy wind" (vs 3-10). Finally, in what I imagine is the crescendo of his song he asks, "WHO IS LIKE THEE?" In answer he glories in the spotless brilliance of His holiness, the awe He inspires in those who adore and praise Him and the marvel of His miraculous works (v 11). Do you Sing?! How and What do yhou sing?!

Have you ever started your day (as soon as you awoke) with a song of praise and worship to your God and Father? Try it! "O Lord my God! When I in awesome wonder consider all the worlds Thy hands have made ... Then sins my soul, my Savior God to Thee; How great Thou art..."

HELP:

1. They sang a song of praise and worship to the LORD for His mighty acts (vs 1-18).

2. [One of mine is: "The LORD is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation."]

3. The nations would be afraid, sorrow, amazed, trembling, melt away, fear, dread, be still as a stone (vs 14-16).

4. Water (v 22), Marah (v 23), tree (v 25).

5. 12 wells and 70 palm trees (v 27).
