## THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

Under great pressure, due to the Philistine invasion and his army going A.W.O.L., Saul intrudes into the priest's office. He disobeys God's clear command and ignores the startling example God made of Korah & Company when they violated the priest's office (Nu 16:1-3, 32-40 Note especially verse 40). Although Saul began his reign in humility, this sin was of such magnitude that God replaced him and his family with a man after His own heart. There is never any excuse for sin that God accepts!

Never under estimate the painful, destructive, far-reaching and lasting results of a sin. Remember, "be sure your sin will find you out" (Nu 32:23).

While Saul did wait "seven days according to the set time that Samuel had appointed" him (v 8), his impatience apparently led him to act profanely as though he were a priest. Are you sometimes impatient? Rule that spirit and save yourself from sinning. Note that Samuel arrived "as soon as" Saul had offered the burnt offering (v 10).
