THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

This chapter finds Israel has angered the LORD. We are not told what their sin or sins were. Their chastening from the LORD, although severe (70,000 died in this case), proved the LORD loved His own (Heb 12:5-7). The LORD uses many forms of chastening. Our response needs to be like David's, "I have sinned" (vs 10, 17), followed by humble submission and obedience to the LORD.

David confessed his sin quickly, even before the prophet Gad came to speak to him (vs 10-11). Be quick to admit and confess your sins! Don't wait for chastening!

In this chapter Joab displays wisdom in counseling David to give up his goal of numbering Israel, but David's word prevailed and Joab reluctantly obeyed. Let us be willing to respectfully, humbly and personally offer counsel to a superior rather than being guilty of the sin of debate, gossip and rebellion against authority.
