PSALM 16; June 20; David Prophecies Christ's Resurrection

ANALYSIS: 1. In whom did the psalmist take great delight?
2. Who did David consider to be the focal point of his inheritance?
3. How did David receive instruction from the LORD during the night seasons?
4. Who is the primary prophetic fulfillment of verses 8-11?
5. In verse 11 who is considering everlasting pleasures?

THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

The resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ is prophesied in this psalm. The Apostle Peter declared the words "For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine holy one to see corruption" (v 10) to apply to Christ (Acts 2:24-27). The Jews believed that four days in the grave resulted in a body beginning to decay and corrupt (John 11:39). But the Lord Jesus Christ rose from the dead after three days. His body did not see corruption. His resurrection from the dead is the single greatest proof that he was the Son of God with power (Rom 1:4). Let us talk about His resurrection and rejoice this day in our victorious, risen Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ!

How much do you delight in the saints of God? David said that all his delight was directed toward the saints and the excellent in the earth (v 3). Are you like David? Do you focus your attention, your charity, your service, your prayers, and your friendship upon the saints of God. What can you do today to show your delight in the people of God?

HELP:

- 1. The saints in the earth, and the excellent (v 3).
- 2. The LORD: Jehovah (v 5).
- 3. From his reins; his heart; the seat of his affections and passions (v 7).
- 4. The Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 2:25-28).
- 5. The Lord Jesus Christ is considering the pleasures at the right hand of his Father in heaven (Heb 12:2).
