ISAIAH 6; July 1; Isaiah's Vision and Commission

## ANALYSIS: 1. What did Isaiah first see and hear in his vision?

2. What did Isaiah say and what was taken away from him?

3. What question did the LORD ask Isaiah and what was his answer?

4. Did Isaiah's ministry to Israel and Judah result in true repentance and spiritual revival, or in final hardening which resulted in their total destruction?

5. What is the bright hope for Israel and Judah which is seen in the last verse?

## THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

God's servants who faithfully sound forth His word always accomplish His purpose on those who hear them. In them that perish the result is death, and in them that are saved the result is life (2 Cor 2:16). Isaiah faithfully preached and warned Israel and Judah although they were not going to respond. They continued in their rebellion and ran to destruction and captivity first by Assyria, then by Babylon and finally by Rome in 70 AD.

When the LORD directs you or me to speak words of exhortation or correction or warning to a brother or sister, we will obey because He is Lord, not because of desired results or the lack thereof.

## HELP:

1. He saw the LORD sitting on a throne, with seraphims above it who cried, Holy, Holy, Holy... the post of the door moved and the house was filled with smoke (vs 1-4).

2. Woe is me, for I am undone ... (v 5); one of the seraphims brought a live coal and cleansed his lips and took away his iniquity and sin (vs 6-7).

3. Whom shall I send and who will go for us (v 8); Here am I, send me (v 8).

4. There would be no true repentance and no conversion (v 10); they would experience cities wasted, houses empty, land desolate and forsaken (vs 11-12).

5. A tenth, that is, a remnant, of the people shall survive and return as the holy seed (v 13).
