THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

The prophet Malachi is sent to Israel about 100 years after their return from Babylonian captivity. The nation questions God's love toward them. The priests had become lax, they treated their duties as burdens rather than honored privileges and inferior sacrifices were being offered. What had brought about this state of carnal religion? Was it the result of being surrounded by enemy people, or the delay in the appearing of the promised Messiah, or unspiritual priests, or a lack of plain Bible teaching or the lack of individuals walking with the LORD?

Rejoice and thank our God for giving us an enthusiastic pastor. Express appreciation for every challenge to holy living, to dedicated service toward others, to consistent giving, to love of the brethren and to love for the word of God and its exposition.
