## II THESSALONIANS 3; November 12; An Example To Follow

ANALYSIS:  1. Paul requested prayer for himself for what two reasons?
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2. What confidence did Paul delight in concerning the Thessalonians?
3. Into what did Paul ask the Lord to direct their hearts?
4. What was Paul's rule for those who were disorderly and who worked not at all?
5. What three-fold command applies to any person who does not obey the message of this epistle?

## THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

The apostles believed in living and working as examples of godliness. Paul called the Philippians to "be followers together of me" and "have us for an ensample" (Phil 3:17). He enthusiastically commended the Thessalonians for their example to all the saints in their area (I Thes 1:6-8). He reminded them that he did not freeload off them, but labored night and day to be an example for them to follow (II Thes 3:7-9). Peter also exhorted the elders to be careful to avoid lording it over God's heritage, and to be examples to the flock (I Pet 5:3). Examples are far better teachers than words alone!

Parents are vital examples for their children to follow. Let all of us be an example of a true follower of our Lord Jesus, and bring honor and glory to Him by all our words and deeds.

## HELP:

- 1. That the word of God may have free course and be glorified; and that he might be delivered from unreasonable and wicked men (vs 1-2).
- 2. That they would do the things he commanded them (v 4).
- 3. Into the love of God; and the patient waiting for Christ (v 5).
- 4. If any would not work, neither should he eat; and that with quietness they work, and eat their own bread (vs 10-12).
- 5. Note that man: [1] have no company with him (that he may be ashamed), [2] count him not as an enemy, [3] but admonish him as a brother (vs 14-15).
