THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:
This New Testament book, called Hebrews, was written to Jewish Christians. One purpose was to set forth the superiority of Jesus Christ -- God's Son -- over every aspect of Old Testament worship. Another purpose was to warn Jewish Christians not to turn away from Christ and return to the ritualism of Judaism because of being persecuted.The Son is declared to be both heir of all things as well as creator.He is the expression of all the attributes of Deity. In particular He took care of the sins of those who believe as no priest had ever done or could do. He "by himself purged our sins" (1:3). He completely removed sin from the sinner, not merely covering it temporarily. He has proven this redemption is finished when He "sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high" (1:3).

You should not wonder if your sins have been taken care of, that is, if you are trusting Jesus who purged away sin. Purge means to remove or free from impurities, to rid of $\sin$, guilt or defilement. You can rejoice with thanksgiving for a Savior Who washed away your sins.
